## Area Attractions

It's not easy to describe Bozeman to someone who's never been. It is one of the most diverse small towns in the Rocky Mountain West. Bozeman is blessed with an eclectic mix of ranchers, artists, professors, ski enthusiasts, and entrepreneurs drawn here by world-class outdoor recreation, Montana State University and a slice of old fashioned America. In addition to the numerous attractions in Bozeman, there are literally hundreds of sights within a short drive, including Yellowstone National Park, that lure visitors from around the world. Bozeman offers a plethora of in-town activities to keep you busy, from exploring the Museum of the Rockies with your children to wandering through the many art galleries downtown. Besides the many opportunities in-town, the surrounding area provides a number of outdoor recreation opportunities.

### Yellowstone National Park - 75 miles south of Bozeman

Yellowstone Park was established in 1872. Its 2.2 million acres include spectacular alpine lakes and rivers, as well as the geysers, mud caldrons and bubbling paint pots of worldwide fame. The park is home to a rich variety of wildlife, including elk, bison, bears and reintroduced wolves. Take time to explore the Park's natural wonders. See the brilliant colors of spring and summer wildflowers or winter's dazzling snow and ice. Watch for eagles, falcons and trumpeter swans among the 303 bird species that live here!

### Lewis & Clark Caverns - 37 miles west of Bozeman

Lewis and Clark Caverns State Park is Montana's first and best-known state park featuring one of the largest known limestone caverns in the Northwest. Naturally air conditioned, these spectacular caves lined with stalactites, stalagmites, columns, and helictites are electrically lighted and safe to visit.

### Museum of the Rockies

The Museum of the Rockies stewards nearly 300,000 objects and 500,000,000 years of history. One of the finest paleontology collections in North America is found under the Museum's roof, along with strong core collections in western history, textiles, Native American artifacts, and photography.

### Fly Fishing

With over 45 state fishing accesses and 1,000 miles of blue-ribbon trout streams, Yellowstone Country truly offers world-class fly fishing. Four of the Top-Ten Fishing Rivers in America are within driving distance of Bozeman: the Gallatin River, the Missouri River, the Madison River, and the Yellowstone River. The best fly fishing runs from late June through October, and a fishing permit is required.

### Tour de Cure, Montana - Rivers, Ranges, and a Reason September 11, 2010

Join the 2nd annual statewide Tour de Cure Montana at the Missouri Headwaters State Park near Three Forks, Montana, west of Bozeman. This Tour de Cure fundraising event offers a memorable day of cycling and fun in a magnificent setting as well as the satisfaction of helping us move closer to victories over diabetes.

All routes have full service rest stops as well as SAG (Support & Gear) vehicles along the way. Crossing the finish line, you will be welcomed as a champion and enjoy a tasty lunch, a massage, music, and other surprises. Whether you are a novice rider or an avid cyclist, we have a route that is perfect for you.
